Internship Performance


Overview: The Educational Leadership (P-12 School) advanced program (EDLE) is the only advanced program for the EPP that falls under CAEP supervision. The EDLE's Internship Performance key assessment is evaluated in EDLE 594 – Internship for School Leadership I and again in EDLE 595 – Internship for School Leadership II. Candidates in EDLE 594 and EDLE 595 complete course assignments throughout the semester while working with a school administrator. The internship experiences and reflections are pieces of the Internship Performance key assessment that identify their content knowledge and ability to demonstrate skills reflecting each of the ten PSEL standards. The completed Internship Performance key assessment, or Portfolio, is the last assignment of the course. The professor of record assesses the Portfolio from each of the rubric components. The scores of approaching standard, meets standard or exceeds standard are derived from the rubric component criteria. The Internship Performance key assessment or Portfolio rubric and candidate requirements were revised in 2020 based on the adoption of PSEL by the BESE Board and NELP as the new accrediting professional organization standards.

The Internship Performance assessment is the most comprehensive and extensive assessment for the program, which is warranted since it encompasses two semesters and takes place at the exit of the program. Each of the 22 criteria for this key assessment are provided below along with standard alignment and mean scores. Data demonstrates 100% of candidates in both Internships I and Internship II across two semesters (N=10) met or exceeded the target performance level of Meets Standard (2) on all portions of this assessment at the exit of the program. This data gives program faculty confidence in the performance and abilities of candidates understanding and demonstrating elements on all NELP standards as well as their competency at completion.
